









DISTRICT READING DATA K-5

DRA & QRI RESULTS

Students at the elementary and intermediate grade levels are tested to determine reading levels. Frank Knight uses the Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA) and Cady Stanton uses the Qualitative Reading Inventory (QRI). Both programs are used to determine instructional reading levels (accuracy and comprehension).
