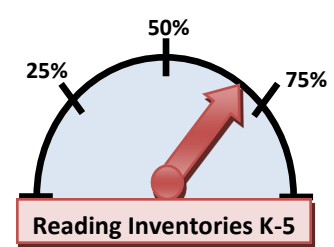

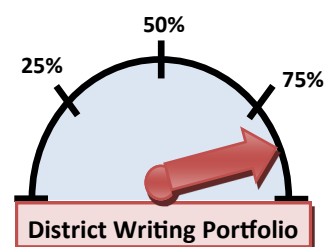

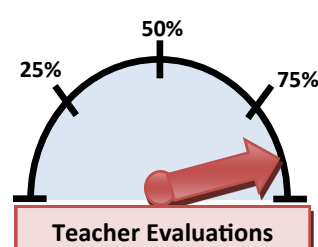

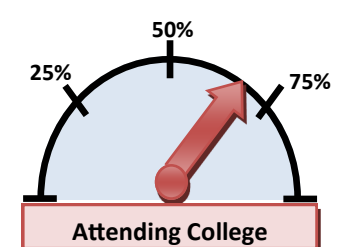

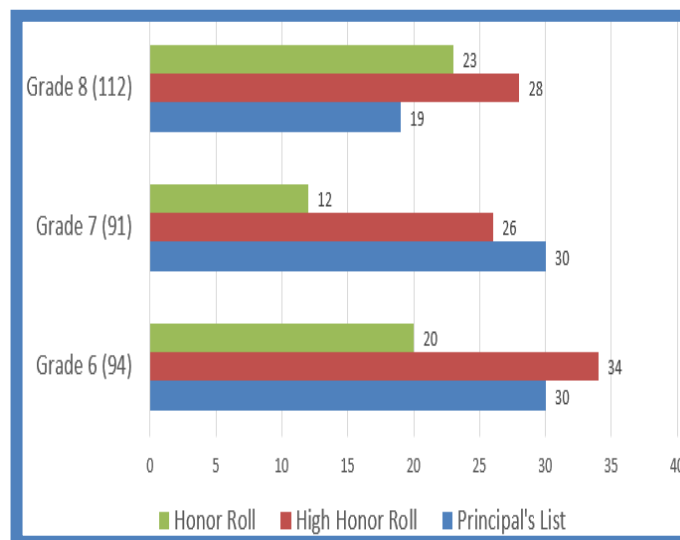

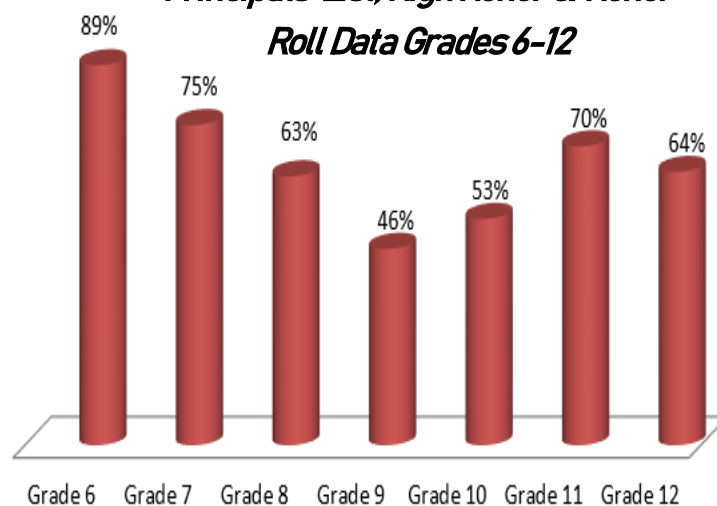

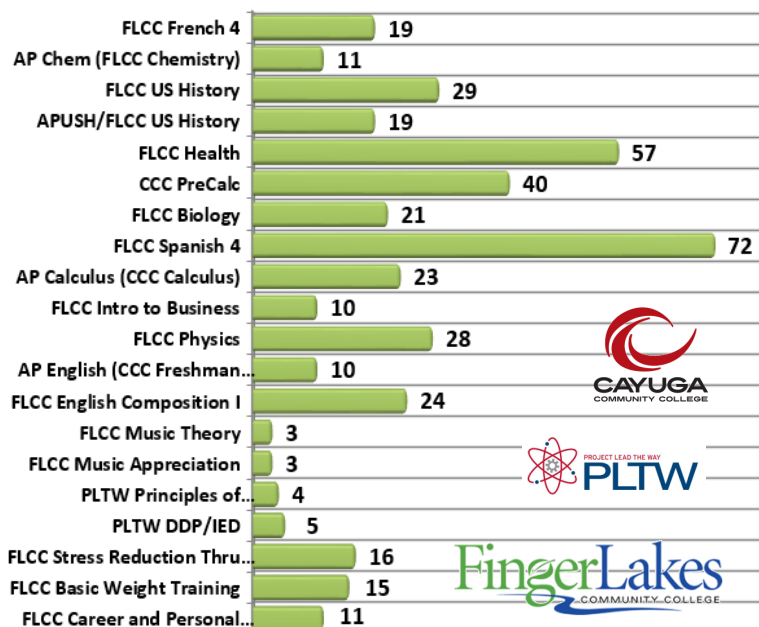

420 Total MA Students registered for 2,104 total college credits in 2019-20





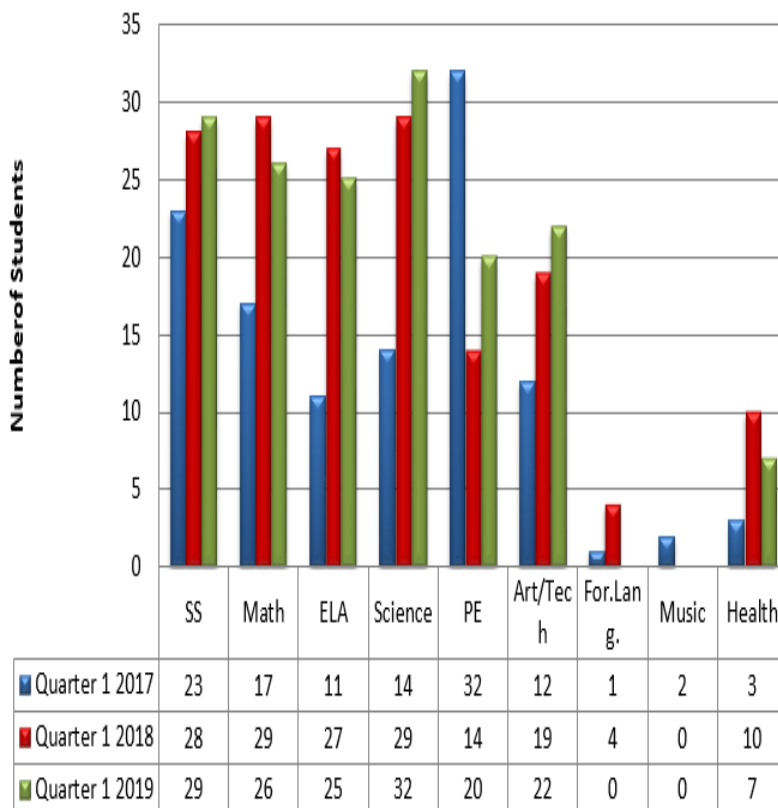

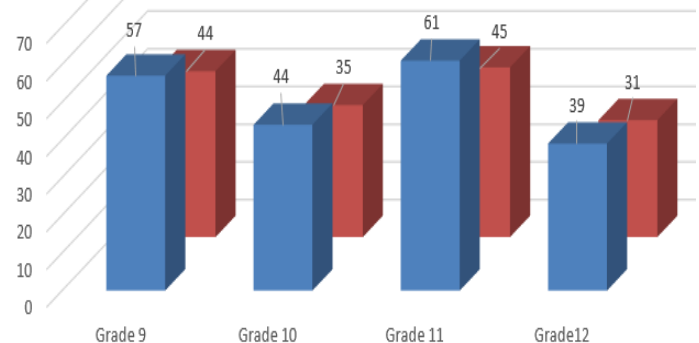

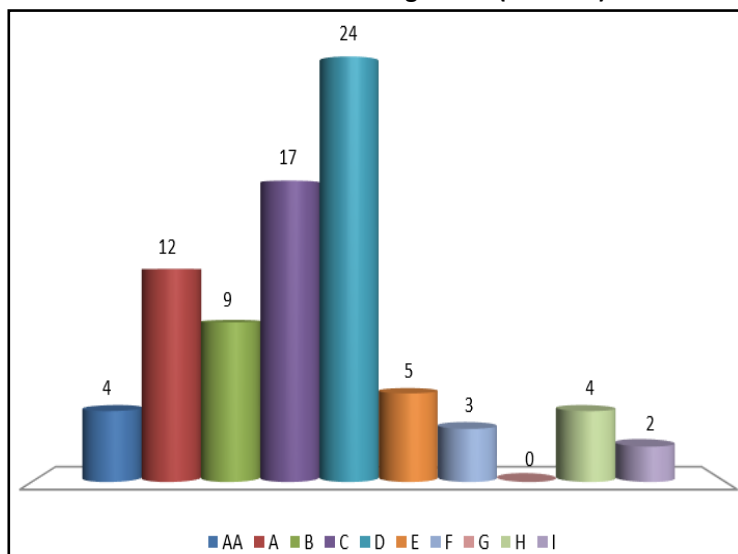




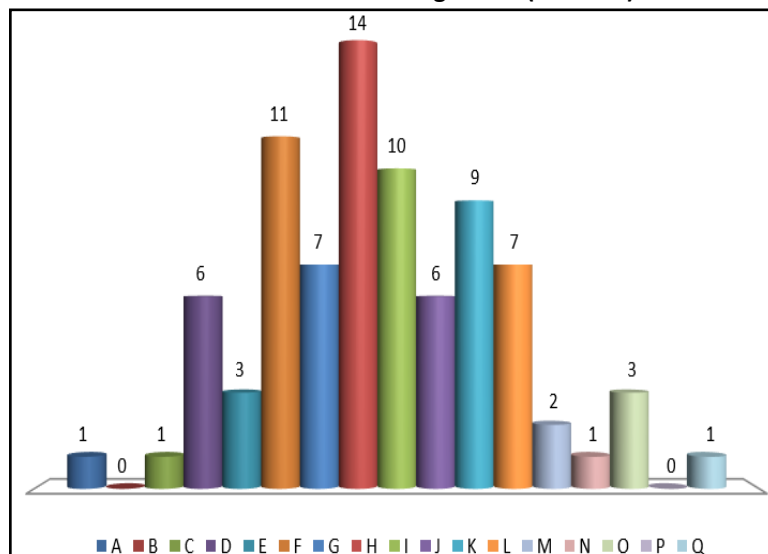

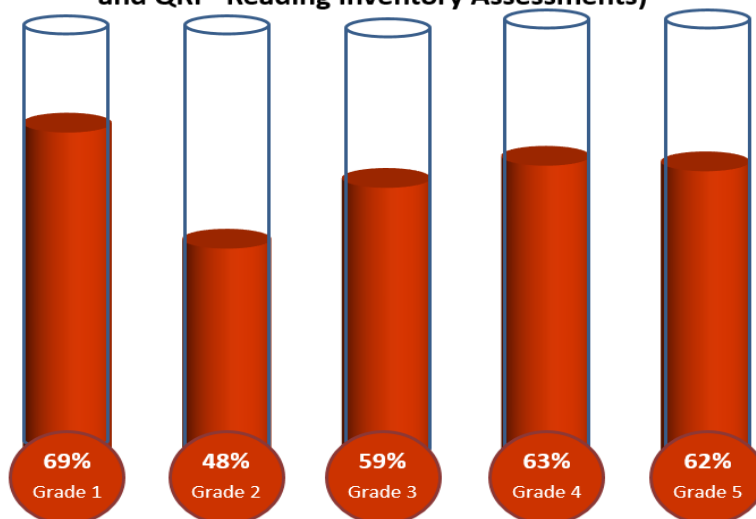
Grade 1 Instructional Reading Levels (DRA Fall)

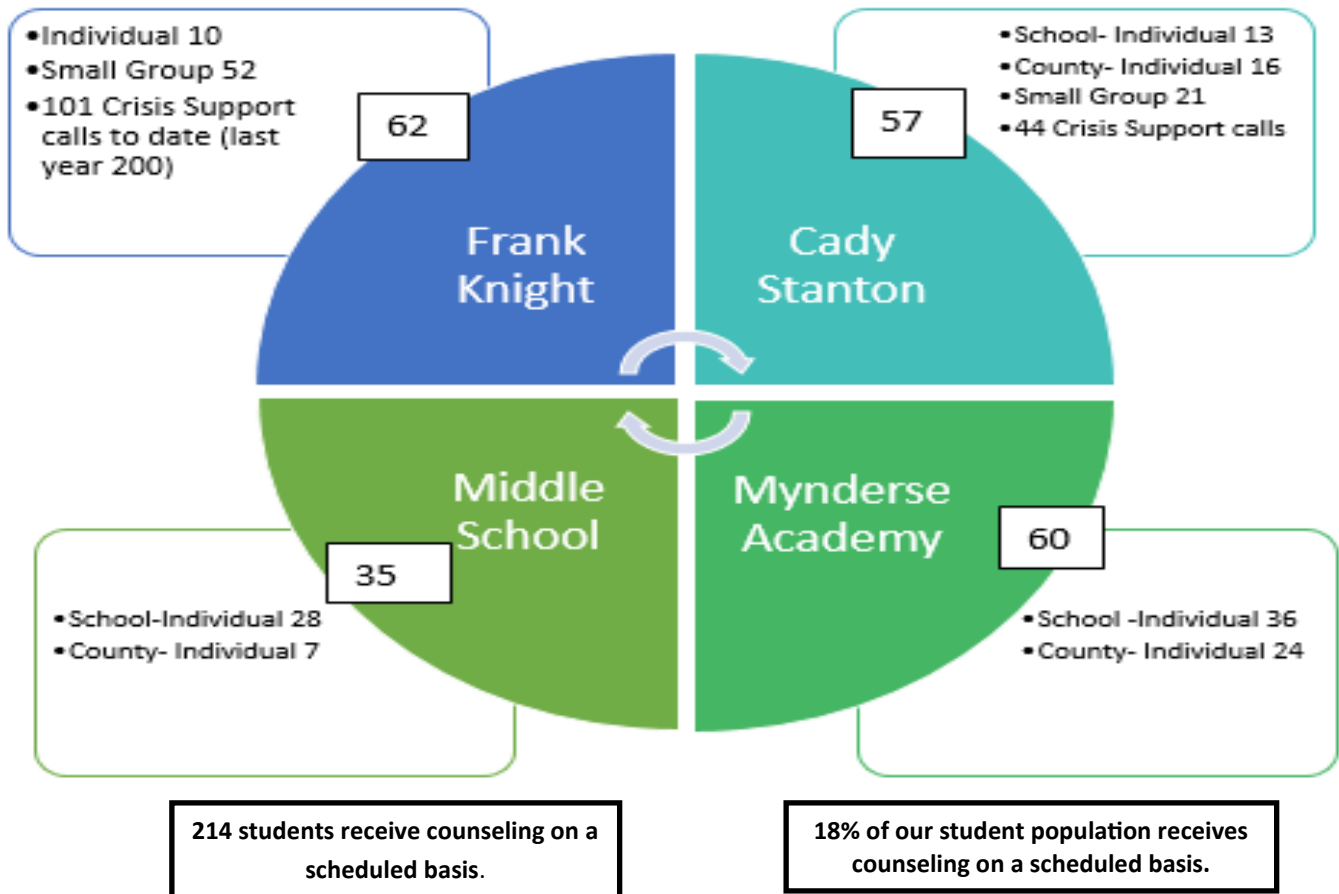
